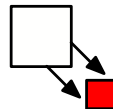


Making a Bug Home

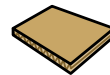

plastic pipe to 20cm . (To reduce, reuse and recycle you can

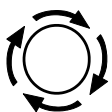


use plastic plant pots, milk cartons or cardboard cups.

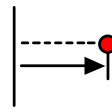
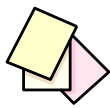


2. Make newspaper tubes by cutting newspaper and rolling

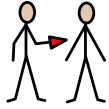


3. Cut the paper tubes to the length of the pot

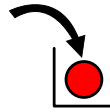
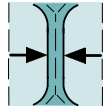


4. If you have some bamboo you can use it as well.

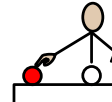
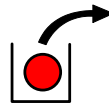
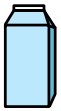


Make sure the hole is at the open end of the container.

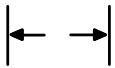
5. Put the tubes tightly into the bottle, pot, cup,



carton or tube so they won't fall out and that the



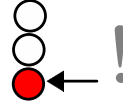
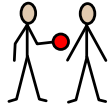
tubes aren't squashed. Make sure the holes are facing

6. Put your bug home on its side in a warm

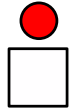
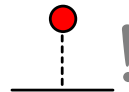
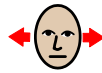


place outside with the open end a bit lower to stop it

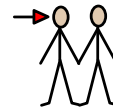


filling with rain.

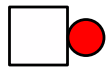
